March 8, 2022

- Ms. Battle called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.

Ms. Springer made a motion to accept the 2-10-22 minutes. Motion seconded by Ms. Walker. Committee unanimously approved.

Dr. Lofton Cooke updated the team concerning data. Current data is not meeting expectations. Student effort and energy seems to be lower than in previous years. The team discussed possible reasons for the lag. Teachers will be asked to send a message in Dojo/Remind reminding parents that it is important that students participate and submit work.

The Summer Program is scheduled for 7-5 to 7-28, M-Th. 8:30 – 12:30. Instruction will start at 8:30 with teachers reporting at 8:00 a.m. Both ELA and Math instruction will be included.

The following programs will be offered. (Maximum class size is 15 for grades K-2; 15 – 20 for grades 3-7)

Grades K- 2 will focus on remediation.

Grades 3-7 will be a project push

Grades 5-7: Science Academy for on-grade level students

There will also be a Technology Enrichment Program and an ESL Academy^{for} Grades 1 – 3.

Lunch will be provided for students

Ms. Delgado reported that there has been some improvement in attendance. For Nov. – Jan. there was a 50% absenteeism rate. For Feb. there was a 37% absenteeism rate. The families of students on the chronic absent list have been contacted. Some referrals have been made to the attendance officer.

Teacher survey codes distributed – requested information is for pre-covid conditions. The team was asked to share this information with colleagues.

NJSLA trial – some issues – working to correct. Receiving devices for testing only.
