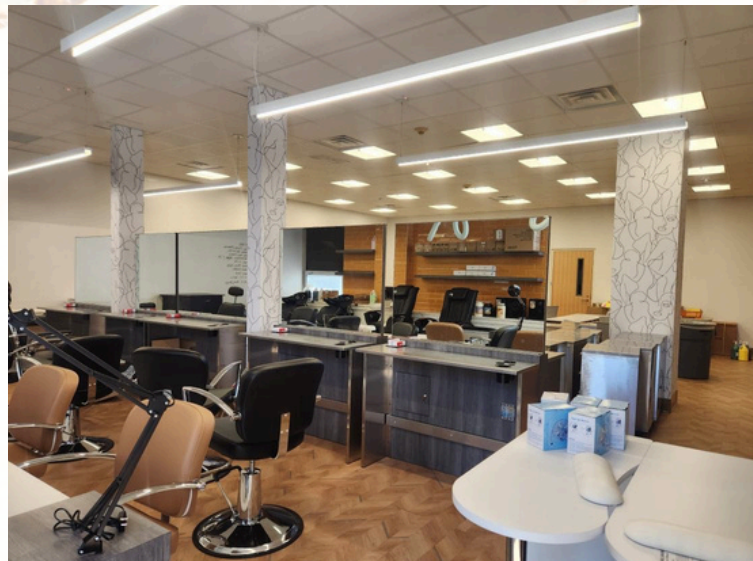

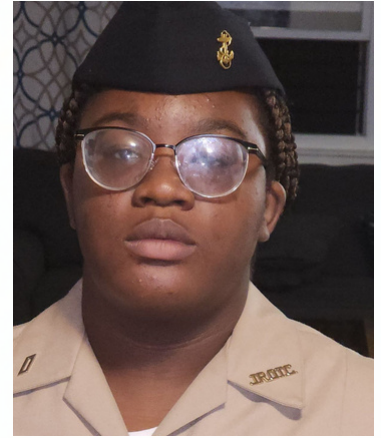

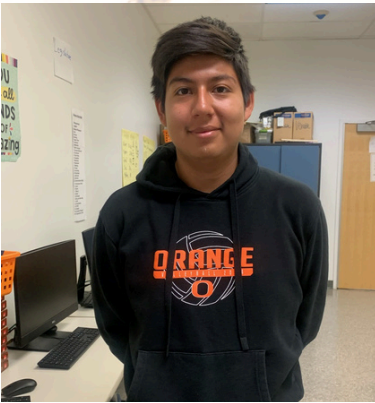
M. Hargrove is eager to learn about cosmetology and is always willing to help others in class.

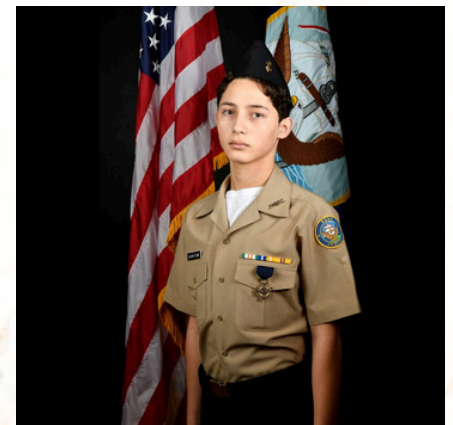

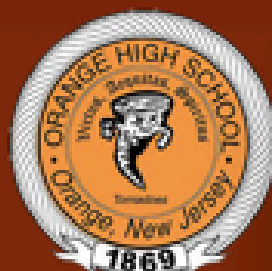
