In partnership with the Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE), the Entrepreneurship program offers students the opportunity to learn how to critically think and plan like entrepreneurs while creating competencies in: critical thinking, communication and collaboration, flexibility and adaptability, comfort with risk, creativity and innovation, initiative and self reliance, future orientation, and opportunity recognition.

The Entrepreneurship program consists of the following courses:
Business Finance, Introduction to Marketing, and Entrepreneurship
with the opportunity to earn 3 college credits from Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Entrepreneurs enter business ownership with various levels of educational backgrounds and certifications. New Jersey's economy relies on small business ownership to keep the economy thriving. Women's Conference at MSU

Keynote speaker Maryann Diaz, a licensed social worker, spoke passionately about "The Power of Words." Student attendees enjoyed a talent show during the conference and had the opportunity to "Walk the Runway" while representing their schools.

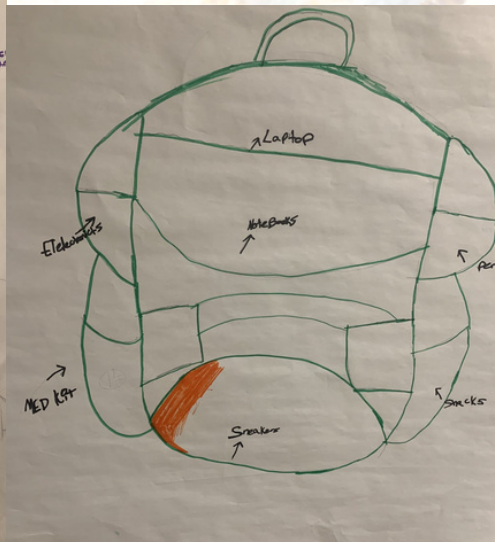
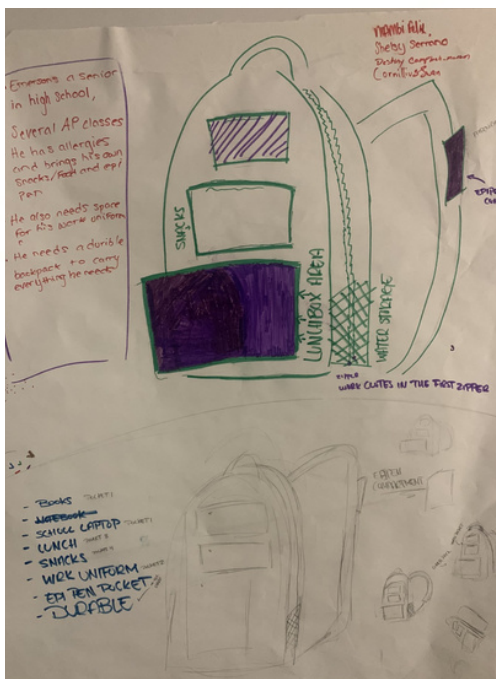


In Emergency and Clinical Care, students learn that time is precious and a good knowledge of human anatomy can make the difference between saving and losing lives in emergency medical situations. The ECC students were tasked with drawing, identifying, and memorizing the major abdominal organs on shirts to properly visualize and understand where everything fits, so they can quickly and accurately assess someone with injuries.

Ms. Martin's Graphic Arts students visited Kean University to learn about admissions and EOF opportunities. They also toured Kean's Graphic Design Department and visited a design class. They observed college students who were designing portfolio projects and had discussions about how the artwork was created

Entrepreneurship students simulated the design thinking process by designing a custom backpack for a specific customer's needs.

Students performed an investigation in which they utilized critical thinking and problem-solving skills to create backpacks that meet the needs of specific users. Human-centered design thinking is a way that businesses think about a client's problem in order to find an appropriate solution.



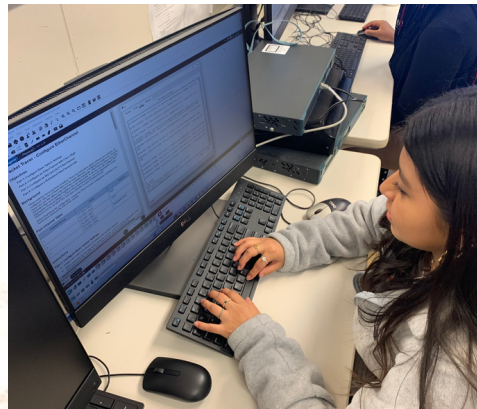
