3. ESL/ELA

- a. Students in ESL classrooms are scoring higher than students in bilingual classrooms
 - i. We need to teach them more often in English and less in Spanish

- 1. Students & parents are comfortable with their native languages and not pushing themselves to speak in English
- ii. ESL should be all English pushed into the general education classroom
- iii. Kindergarten some students are not properly placed based on their WIDA score (ESL vs Bilingual)

 - i. Lesson Plans
 - Some pacing guides fall inappropriately on holiday/shortened weeks, leading to a delay within the guide.
 - 2. SpEd classes struggle based on IEPs to follow pacing to appropriately as per their modifications
 - a. There is a modified pacing guide
 - Solutions:
 - a. Create teacher buddy systems to help with lesson planning/pacing

 - ii. Grading
